HTC Evo 4G LTE



Sprint's third 4G LTE smart phone, the HTC Evo 4G LTE, was released on June 2, 2012. In addition to what users have come to expect from HTC devices, this phone offers many new features, including Beats Audio for music lovers. And, like many HTC phones, it is equipped with a kickstand which can be used to prop up the phone for a variety of reasons (use it as a clock; enjoy better music quality when not using headphones, etc.).

The dimensions of the Evo 4G LTE are 5.31" (L) x 2.72" (W) x 0.35 T (T) and weighs only 4.73 ounces. So, it is easily held in the hand. Texting and web searching are made simple with its virtual QWERTY keyboard and the display is visually pleasing on its 4.7 inch HD screen. The Evo 4G LTE runs on the Android 4.0 operating system, so it's generally up to date and reliable. However, even though the Evo 4G LTE is a

4G phone, Sprint's 4G LTE network is not necessarily always available, so the phone is often running on the 3G network, which is noticeably slower.

The Evo 4G LTE uses a 2000 mAh battery, which, depending on other usage, will last for approximately 7.5 hours of talk time. The memory consists of 1GB RAM, 16GB ROM, and is microSDHC compatible. This is plenty of memory for the average user storing pictures and videos from the 8MP camera, which is capable of taking photographs directly from video; a new feature that phone photographers should take pleasure in.
